Tancred 1841-1860; South Newington Churchwardens' Accounts 1553-1684; Wigginton Constables' Books 1691-1836; Bodicote Parish Accounts 1700-1822; and Administrations and Inventories of the Archdeaconry of Northampton 1711-1800. Volumes in preparation include Banbury Wills and Inventories 1591-1620 and 1661-1723; Banbury Burial Register 1723-1812 and Baptisms and Burials 1812-1838; and an edition of letters to the 1st Earl of Guilford (of Wroxton, father of Lord North the Prime Minister).

EDITORIAL NOTE

The rising cost of printing has led to two changes in the form of this volume of Oxoniensia. Firstly, the volume has been produced by photolithography, a method which, as well as being cheaper than the older hot metal process, enables the plates to be incorporated, at no extra cost, in the text of the articles they illustrate. Secondly, much of the technical detail of the report of the excavations in the Hamel, Oxford, has been published on microfiche and inserted in a pocket in the back cover of this volume. The printed article contains an introductory note and a detailed table of contents which make clear which parts of the report are printed in full and which are on microfiche. The editor and the author feel that the printed report contains all the information of interest to the general reader, and that those, mainly professional archaeologists, who wish to use the specialist reports will have no difficulty with the microfiche.
